M: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



GOD'S WORD FOR TODAY

FIRST LESSON: 2 Kings 4:17-37

¹⁷ But the woman became pregnant, and the next year about that same time she gave birth to a son, just as Elisha had told her.

¹⁸ The child grew, and one day he went out to his father, who was with the reapers. ¹⁹ He said to his father, "My head! My head!"

His father told a servant, "Carry him to his mother." ²⁰ After the servant had lifted him up and carried him to his mother, the boy sat on her lap until noon, and then he died. ²¹ She went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God, then shut the door and went out.

²² She called her husband and said, "Please send me one of the servants and a donkey so I can go to the man of God quickly and return."

²³ "Why go to him today?" he asked. "It's not the New Moon or the Sabbath."

"That's all right," she said.

²⁴ She saddled the donkey and said to her servant, "Lead on; don't slow down for me unless I tell you." ²⁵ So she set out and came to the man of God at Mount Carmel.

When he saw her in the distance, the man of God said to his servant Gehazi, "Look! There's the Shunammite! ²⁶ Run to meet her and ask her, 'Are you all right? Is your husband all right? Is your child all right?'"

"Everything is all right," she said.

PSALM OF THE DAY: Psalm 116 (printed on p. 107 In the front part of your hymnal)

SECOND LESSON: Romans 8:11-19

²⁷ When she reached the man of God at the mountain, she took hold of his feet. Gehazi came over to push her away, but the man of God said, "Leave her alone! She is in bitter distress, but the LORD has hidden it from me and has not told me why."

²⁸ "Did I ask you for a son, my lord?" she said. "Didn't I tell you, 'Don't raise my hopes'?"

²⁹ Elisha said to Gehazi, "Tuck your cloak into your belt, take my staff in your hand and run. Don't greet anyone you meet, and if anyone greets you, do not answer. Lay my staff on the boy's face."

³⁰ But the child's mother said, "As surely as the LORD lives and as you live, I will not leave you." So he got up and followed her.

³¹ Gehazi went on ahead and laid the staff on the boy's face, but there was no sound or response. So Gehazi went back to meet Elisha and told him, "The boy has not awakened."

³² When Elisha reached the house, there was the boy lying dead on his couch. ³³ He went in, shut the door on the two of them and prayed to the LORD. ³⁴ Then he got on the bed and lay on the boy, mouth to mouth, eyes to eyes, hands to hands. As he stretched himself out on him, the boy's body grew warm. ³⁵ Elisha turned away and walked back and forth in the room and then got on the bed and stretched out on him once more. The boy sneezed seven times and opened his eyes.

³⁶ Elisha summoned Gehazi and said, "Call the Shunammite." And he did. When she came, he said, "Take your son." ³⁷ She came in, fell at his feet and bowed to the ground. Then she took her son and went out.

¹¹ And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you.

¹² Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation—but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.

¹⁴ For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. ¹⁵ The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought

about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father." ¹⁶ The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. ¹⁷ Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

¹⁸ I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed.

VERSE OF THE DAY:

The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many. (Mark 10:45 cf. NIV)

THE GOSPEL: John 11:17-27,38-45

M: The Gospel according to Luke chapter 16.

¹⁷ On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. ¹⁸ Now Bethany was less than two miles from Jerusalem, ¹⁹ and many Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them in the loss of their brother. ²⁰ When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed at home.

²¹ "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask."

²⁷ "Yes, Lord," she replied, "I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who is to come into the world."

²³ Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."

²⁴ Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day."

²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; ²⁶ and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

 38 Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. 39 "Take away the stone," he said.

"But, Lord," said Martha, the sister of the dead man, "by this time there is a bad odor, for he has been there four days."

⁴³ When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" ⁴⁴ The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face.

Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go."

⁴⁵ Therefore many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

"Special thanks to all our new online worshiping visitors! We're glad you joined us!

~Just a Reminder:

All in-person worship services and other in-person activities are cancelled at this time until further notice. This is not the first decision we wished to make. We rejoice with those who say "Let us go to the house of the LORD!" (Psalm 122:1) However, we also want to take into consideration both the fourth and fifth commandment. Therefore, taking into consideration our government's proposals with legitimate care for her citizens and the care of our own people and the people around us, we thought it wise to follow this line of action. This does not mean that we need to neglect our souls and the Word of God. At times like this, spiritual health is key for strength and comfort from God and his power and his gospel! But remember also that worship is not limited to a building, but takes place in spirit and truth (John 4:24). With this in mind, we want to continue to offer you care for your soul with suggestions of things you can do at home on your own along with actions we will be implementing.

We shall continue to strive to put our worship services online Sunday morning in a similar format as what you have used in this worship packet (remember your offerings can be mailed to the office as we continue to give to the Lord and keep our church operating). He is also experimenting with online options for continuing Bible Classes. Pastor will work to increase online presence on Facebook, YouTube, our website and podcast stations (iTunes and Stitcher) to offer extra spiritual encouragement. Our weekly email will continue to have a devotional thought along with any notes or updates for our congregation. Also, as Pastor also socially distances himself for both his health and the health of others, he will work on calling in on members from time to time to try and meet any needs they may have.

The synod also has many opportunities for you to take for your spiritual wellbeing. Should you wish for extra encouragement in the way of worship services, the synod has offered a list of churches which offer livestreaming (https://yearbook.wels.net/streaming). You can and would certainly benefit from continuing to read your Meditations at home. The WELS has daily devotions you can subscribe to online (and we shall also share them everyday on Facebook). And Time of Grace is always a wonderful option as well, offering their TV program, devotions, videos and the like (you can find their website by clicking this link: https://timeofgrace.org/). Also, don't forget the Lutheran Chapel Service on KNUJ (860am, knuj.net, 97.3FM) at 7:45am-8:30am on Sunday mornings. These are just a few of the opportunities our synod offers to you in such a time as this.

We pray these can help your spiritual health in this time when we are unable to gather, should it be just a week and half or should it go even longer. If you would find another way to grow helpful for you, don't hesitate to ask Pastor to try and take it into consideration and add it to this regiment. And should you need a pastoral visit, Pastor will still be available by phone and email to set up a private consultation on an individual basis. (Don't hesitate! Pastor wants to serve as you need!).
